

Meadow Springs into sports

AN open space project at Meadow Springs has received \$1.1 million in Federal Government funding to provide purpose-built sporting and community facilities with an education, business and tourism component.

Announcing the funding at Meadow Springs last week, WA Senator Mathias Cormann said Mandurah was the sixth fastest growing local government area in Australia.

"Growth like this brings many challenges when it comes to the social and capital infrastructure needs for the region," he said.

Canning MHR Don Randall said the facility would ensure people of all ages could enjoy recreation close to their homes.

The concept plan includes a main cricket oval, main rugby field, a colts/veterans field, synthetic cricket pitch and club facilities. It will be built between Oakmont Avenue and the RAAFA estate.
